THE GATEWAY TO THE MUSKOKA LAKES

Gravenhurst is a town rich in tradition and natural beauty, surrounded on all sides with the beauty of lakes, islands, rocks and forests. In the early 20th century, cottagers would disembark the train in Gravenhurst, and take one of the many steam-powered boats to the various resorts on Lake Muskoka. Today, the RMS Seguin is the last surviving of the original steam-boats and Gravenhurst is a pretty town full of Muskoka charm offering plenty of recreational opportunities from water sports, sailing, canoeing, fishing and kayaking in summer, to cross-country skiing, snowmobiling and skating in the winter.

Notable features:

- Borders on Lake Muskoka, the largest of the lakes in this district
- Home port of the RMS Segwun, the oldest vessel powered by a working steam engine in North America.
- Newly revitalized wharf which showcases shops, restaurants and a museum is a vital social area for town residents and cottagers
- Very popular cottage and resort district due to the many surrounding lakes
- Main industries include tourism, pulp & paper and hardwood products
- Minor league hockey and lacrosse teams
